9:30 AM **Opportunity Wood In Ontario: Maximizing Economic Benefit Using a Supply Chain Modelling Approach**

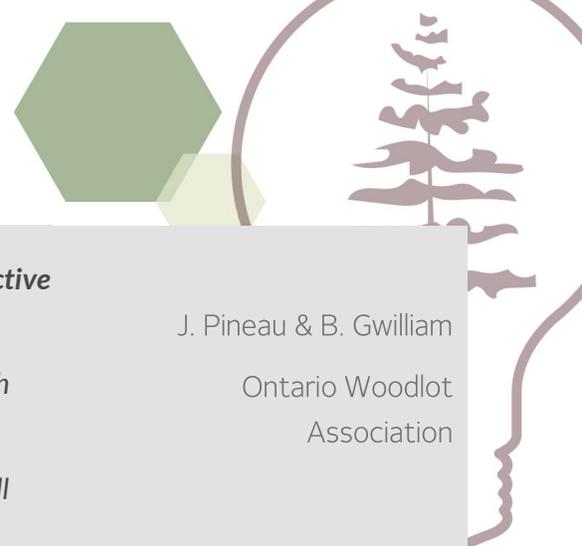
